

Weed Alert

Salvinia molesta

(Giant Salvinia, Kariba Weed, Aquarium watermoss)





- ✓ Salvinia molesta is a water fern that can reproduce extremely rapidly, doubling its numbers in 2-10 days.
- ✓ Extremely small fragments are viable propagules.
- ✓ Big problem in Lake Wilson on Oahu, could have been avoided with awareness and preventative action.
- ✓ Native to Brazil.
- ✓ The plant is federally prohibited in the US, and is therefore illegal to sell or possess.

How did it get here?

 Garden pond and aquarium trade, or small fragments accidentally introduced into water bodies in aquatic ornamentals.

Why is it harmful?

✓ Salvinia molesta alters productivity of fresh waters, reducing fishery yields; thick mats prevent oxygen absorption into water, and block light, shading out underwater plants and killing fish.

How do we control it?

✓ Prevent new infestations, and report infestations of all sizes. Early detection and eradication are crucial to controlling Salvinia without chemical methods.
