

## The difference between Greenhouse and Coqui frogs:

| Characteristics   | GREENHOUSE FROG<br>E. planirostris   | PLEASE COQUI FROG PLEASE REPORT! E. coqui   |
|---|--|---|
| Body shape<br>and size<br>(maximum adult<br>length)               | < 1 inch long     Narrower body shape     (not reportable)   | Slightly > 1 inch long; adults about 11/2 times larger than greenhouse frogs     Rounder body shape   |
| Color   | Usually copper colored, mottled with black spots     No mid-dorsal line (along back from nose to tail)     Warty textured skin | Greater variation in color, from light yellow to dark brown     May be mottled with black spots     Mid-dorsal line (stripe along back) may or may not be visible |
| Shape of snout (head portion in front of eyes)  Toes and toe pads | Narrower snout     Claw-like toes; toe pads not distinct   | Broader, bow-shaped snout     Suction cup-like toe pads   |
| Male calling sounds   | Soft, bird-like or cricket-like chirping   | Loud two-tone call, "ko-kee"  |
| Habitat   | Exclusively on ground level  | From ground level to tops of trees  |
| Quarantine<br>status  | Not a quarantine pest  | Only an inter-island quarantine pest  |
